George Frederick Miller, III '29, passed away on January 8, 1994. His daughter, Kristina Prine, wrote to us from Salem, Oregon. Mr. Miller was raised in Huntington, WV and moved to New Mexico in 1948.

James E. Hassell '55, died September 29, 1993, of cancer at his home in Chestnut Hill, PA. An associate professor of history at Philadelphia College of Textiles and Science since 1974, Hassell held a PhD in Russian and English history and public administration from Cornell University. His undergraduate degree was from Antioch College. Dr. Hassell is survived by his wife, Sigrid, and two daughters. As a scholar, he con-

ducted extensive research in the former Soviet Union and in France about post-revolutionary Russian emigres. In 1991 he published a book on the subject.

Stephen H. Anderson '52, died April 8, 1994, at King's Daughter's Hospital in Staunton, VA, at age 61. Born in Columbus, Ohio, he was a retired road contractor with Anderson's Paving Inc. at Rupert, WV, and prior to his illness was a salesman with Hays Chevrolet. He is survived by his widow, Mary Alice, and two daughters.

Ashby G. Patterson '40, died March 19, 1994, at his home in Bridgewater, VA, at age 71. He was a retired farmer, entrepreneur and businessman. He worked with the Bridgewater Volunteer Food Pantry and was instrumental in founding Central

Valley Habitat for Humanity of which he served as president for several years. He was a U.S. Army veteran of 15 years beginning in World War II and also saw combat in Korea.

Charles W. "Doc" Switzer '24, died April 2, 1994, at age 89. A lifelong resident of Augusta County, VA, he had retired from Southern States Cooperative as manager of Augusta Petroleum Cooperative. He was a charter member of Beverley Manor Ruritan Club and life member of Staunton Lions Club. He is survived by his widow, Marvey (Berry) Switzer. He was a graduate of Bridgewater College.

Richard L. Geist '45, died December 5, 1993. He was a resident of Woodmere, New York.
