



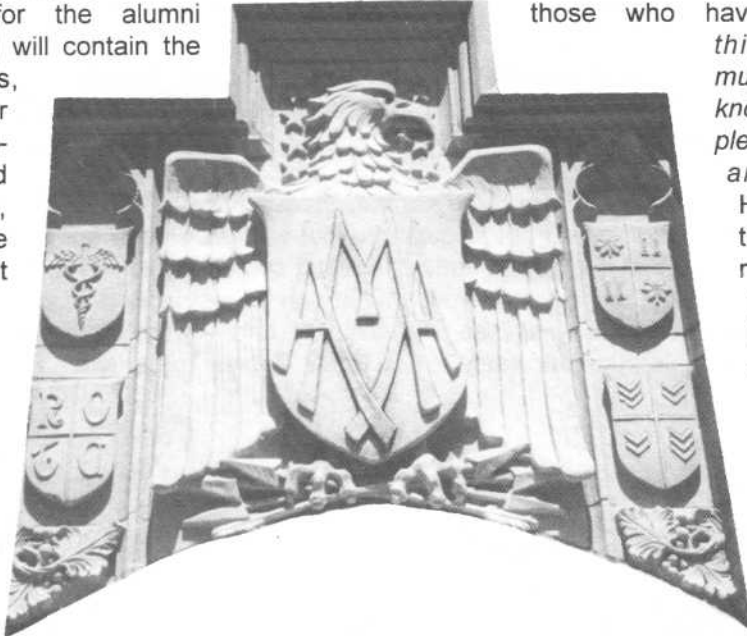
AMA Alumni House moves ahead

Church will lease Roller house to association

A lease to be drawn between the Augusta Military Academy Alumni Association and the consortium of Pentecostal churches that now owns Augusta will establish the AMA Alumni House, to include an AMA Museum, in the old Roller House in the center of the school campus. Alumni House will be headquarters for the alumni association and will contain the alumni offices, space for storage of alumni records and memorabilia, and will feature the long sought AMA Museum on the first floor. "The AMA Alumni House will be the focus of all alumni activities and the center point of our efforts to perpetuate the name and legacy of Augusta," said AMA Alumni Association President **Goodloe Saunders, '57**.

The historic Roller House was built sometime after the Civil War by **Professor Charles S. Roller**, founder of the school. In the house were born **Colonel Thomas Roller, Major/Colonel/General Charles Roller, Jr.**, their brother **Dr. W. C. Roller** and **Maggie Belle** who in later years married **Colonel Warren Robinson**. She lived in the house until her death in 1956. The building later housed the Band, then became the school library.

Much of the restoration work will be done by

1939

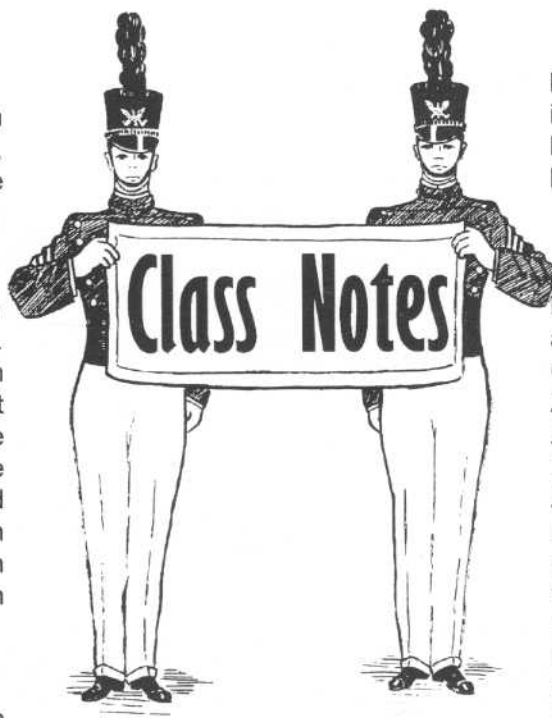
