(LARRY KURTZ)

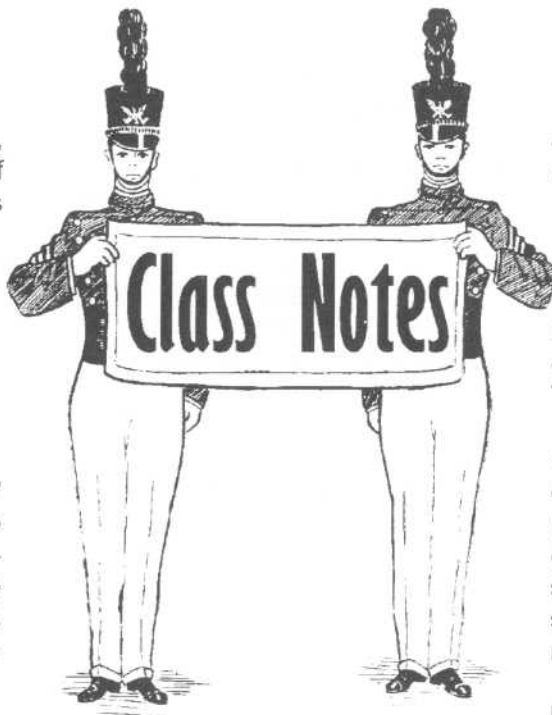
