BLACKWELL, WILLIAM PRENTISS '38

Died 27 December 2004, in Lynchburg. A 25-year employee of the Lynchburg Engraving Company.

Blackwell received a BA from the University of Virginia and B.S. and M.S. from Virginia Tech. He worked ten years as a game biologist for the Virginia Commission of Game and Inland Fisheries. He served as President of the Virginia Isaac Walton League; President of Central Virginia Alive; Chairman of task force that created Kaleidoscope Festival and was its first president.

Served in US Army Cavalry in World War II, was awarded a Purple Heart, and was discharged at the rank of captain.

At Augusta for two years: Corporal, C Company and a member of the cavalry troop; winner of the Intramural Basketball Medal.

Survived by a daughter, Katherine Roach of Richmond; a son, William, Jr., of Altavista, VA; and two grandchildren: Sara Roach of Richmond and Adele Blackwell Caputo of Kissimmee, FL.
