



## Remembering our brothers who have passed from this life

### **CLYBORNE, CLARENCE ALFRED JR. '37**

Last seen alive by fellow crewmen on 3 December 1943, US Army 2<sup>nd</sup> Lieutenant Clyborne, member of the 9<sup>th</sup> Bombardment Squadron, was injured and captured by the Japanese 1 December 1943 after his B-24 was shot down near Rangoon, Burma.

Crew members witnessed a Japanese officer repeatedly beating Clyborne's broken leg with the flat side of a sword. He was executed by the Japanese sometime in December 1943. His body was never recovered.

He received the Air Medal and was memorialized on the "Wall of the Missing" in the American Cemetery, Manila, Philippines.

Clyborne came from Bluefield, WV, for four years at Augusta. First year: Private "B" Company, Minnow Athletics, Intramural 115-pound Boxing Champion. Second year: Corporal "B" Company, Intramural Athletics, Peep Football Team. Third year: Platoon Sergeant, "A" Company, Manager

of Basketball Team, Varsity Football Squad, Vice President of the Bible Class, Secretary and Treasurer of the Ciceronian Literary Society, Y.M.C.A. Cabinet, Honor Committee, Honor Roll, Photography Editor 1936 Recall, Intramural Swimming Medal. Fourth year: Captain, "D" Company, *Ad Astra Per Aspera* Society member, President of the Student Body, President of the Y.M.C.A., President of the Honor Committee, President of the Bible Class, General Manager Junior Athletics, Minor Monogram, Manager of the Boxing Team, Cheer Leader, Editor of the 1937 *Recall*, Cotillion Club, Final Ball Committee, Leader of the Opening Dances, Leader of the Y.M.C.A. Dance, Assistant Leader of Thanksgiving Dances.
