Thomas Edwin Hart, 70, of Crimora, Virginia, passed away on Wednesday, April 25, 2018, at AHC. He was born on February 26, 1948, in Queens, New York, the son of Edwin and Jean Reber Hart. Many cadets knew Tom's father, Ed Hart, as teacher at AMA.

Tom graduated from Augusta Military Academy and joined the Navy in 1968. The Navy trained and then assigned him to be a Mineman Specialist.
