HAW, GEORGE EDWIN JR. '40

George Edwin Haw Jr., of Richmond, died at his home after a long illness on 21 June 2008 at the age of 87. He attended St. Christopher's School, graduated from Augusta Military Academy, attended Washington & Lee University and graduated from the law school of Washington & Lee University. His roommate at both AMA and W&L was **William Gaither Murchison Jr. '40**, who died in 1985.

Haw left Washington & Lee University at the beginning of WWII, enlisted in the army, and was assigned originally to the medic corps. He later received infantry training at Tidworth Barracks in England and was reassigned to the 45th Infantry Division (Thunderbirds). He received the Combat Infantryman Badge for action in France and Germany. After WWII he was commissioned a Second Lieutenant.

He later married and raised his family in Richmond while building a successful law practice until his retirement. He joined his father in

practicing law at the firm of Haw & Haw in Richmond. The law firm merged into Satterfield, Haw, Anderson, Parkerson & Beazley and finally Anderson, Haw, Parkerson and Beazley.

He is survived by his son, George E. Haw III, his wife, Lynn G. Haw; and their children, George W. Haw and E. Lindsay Haw; his daughter, Evelyn H. Wilton, her husband, Arthur E. Wilton; and their children, A. Justin Wilton and Andrew R. Wilton; his son, Thomas R. Haw, his wife, Margaret M. Haw; and their children, Dabney M. Haw and Thomas R. Haw Jr.

He enjoyed waterfowl hunting, fishing and boating throughout his life. He will be remembered by his friends and family as having not only a sharp memory but an even sharper wit. He was always there to support his family during good times and bad. Burial was in Hollywood Cemetery.
