HERRING, JOHN AUGUSTUS III, '47

Died 20 April 2012 in Richmond, aged 82.

Herring graduated from the Virginia Military Institute in 1951. He served as a first lieutenant in the Air Force during the Korean War with the 49th Bomber Squadron.

After the war, he received a Master of Arts degree from the University of Virginia and went on to serve as an Assistant Dean at UVA and Director of Newcomb Hall, 1958-1989. He organized the University Artists Series, bringing world renowned performers to the Charlottesville campus. He donated a number of important items to the UVA Art Museum and provided the AMA Library with more than 900 books.

A dedicated Francophile, he arranged the return to the Palace at Versailles of a snuffbox depicting the execution of Queen Marie Antoinette. His former students created the John Herring Scholarship for Social Awareness and he received the Distinguished Service Award from the University of Virginia Alumni Association.

Survived by a nephew, John Hannan of Bluefield, WV.
