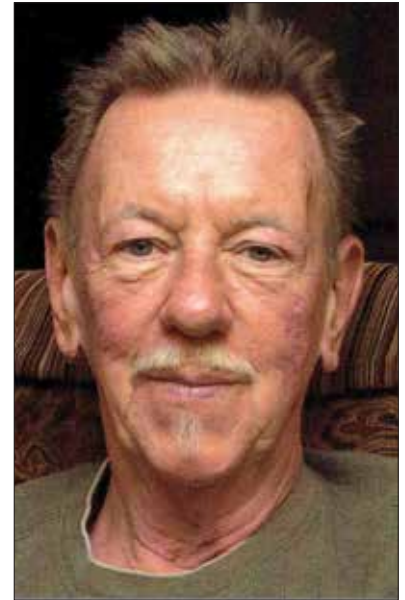
Ernest Winfield Kilton, '65
