KNICELY, CARROLL F. '46

Died 2 November 2006, Glasgow, KY, 77. A member of the Roller Society and a significant contributor to the AMA Museum, underwriting one of the main exhibit rooms.

Newspaper publisher. Born in Staunton, he worked at the Waynesboro *News Virginian* before partnering with the owner of the paper to purchase another paper in Glasgow. Knicely also owned interests in newspapers in Columbia, Campbellsville, Middlesboro, Hopkinsville, Pineville, Scottsville and Shepherdsville, KY and owned a printing facility near Louisville.

Former President, Travelers Protective Association. Regent and Vice Chairman, Western Kentucky University. He was responsible for success of WKU's journalism department and a major building on the WKU campus is named for him.

Served as Commerce Commissioner under Kentucky Governor Julian Carroll, Secretary of Commerce for Governor Martha Lane Collins, and briefly as a special assistant to Governor Wallace Wilkinson. During these periods of government service, he was instrumental in bringing a Corvette plant to Bowling Green and a Toyota plant to Georgetown. Fifty year Rotarian with near perfect attendance.

Survived by his wife, Evelyn Furr Knicely; two sons, Carroll, Jr. and Daryl; three daughters, Kaye Gaines, Brenda Kramer and Beverly White; two brothers, Vick Knicely of Staunton and Larry of Harrisonburg; four grandchildren, and three great-grandchildren.
