LAKE, REAR ADMIRAL JULIAN S. III, '40

Died 2 March 2013 in Frederick, MD, aged 90. Admiral Lake was a resident of Binghamton, NY, for 20 years until the death of his wife in 2012. He was a graduate of Virginia Tech and George Washington University.

Lake joined the Navy in 1942 and became a night and weather Naval aviator. He served in World War II, the Korean War, and the Vietnam War. He commanded a carrier air group on the *USS Forrestal* and later he commanded the *USS John F. Kennedy*. His final tour was as Commander of the Naval Electronics Systems Command. He earned three Air Medals in WW II, the Bronze Star in Vietnam, and the Navy Commendation Medal in Korea.

After retiring from the Navy in 1976, Admiral Lake lived in California for 14 years where he published *Countermeasures* magazine. He was a consultant for several defense contractors.

Survived by his first wife, Barbara Brooks Dougherty, of Potomac Falls, VA, and their three children, seven grandchildren, and one great-grandchild.
