Died 21 May 2001, at home, in Roanoke, age 90.

He was a graduate of Roanoke College and Duke University, and he served as Officer in the US Navy during World War II.

He was President, Valley Lumber Company, for more than 50 years. His company was highly respected for its excellence in the creation of custom wood products, and its work can be found in many homes and public buildings, including Colonial Williamsburg, The Greenbrier, The Homestead, and The Center in the Square.

Mr. Lemon was a director of the First National Bank and served on the planning commission for the City of Roanoke. He served as president of the Kiwanis Club and the Toastmaster's Club. He was an active member of the Roanoke Country Club, the Elks Club, the Sons of the American

Revolution and the Audobon Society. He was an enthusiastic athlete and coached little league baseball for many years The City of Roanoke honored him on his 90th birthday with "C. K. Lemon Day."
