McCUE, LTC JOHN CYRUS JR. '27

Born 9 November 1910, died 20 October 1969.

Cy McCue was a Day Student at Augusta and thus ineligible for the *Ad Astra per Aspera* society, although he was second in his class. He was considered by many to have been the brightest student to have attended AMA. He was inducted as an Honorary *Ad Astra Per Aspera* in 1939, while serving as a member of the faculty.

Cy took BS and MS degrees at the University of Virginia, where he was a member of Theta Delta Chi fraternity. He returned to teach at AMA, left to serve during the war, and returned to AMA after the war was over. He served five years active duty with the US Army in World War II with service in the Pacific Theater in New Guinea, the Philippines, and the Army of Occupation in Japan.

He was an active member of the Augusta Stone Church, where he served as a deacon and church treasurer for a number of years. He also served several terms as a member of the Augusta Planning Commission.

McCue served as a member of the faculty and the Academic Board at Augusta until his death. In addition to his teaching, he operated a farm and ran the Verona Hardware Company.

At Augusta five years, he graduated in 1926 and returned for a year of post-graduate study. He played basketball and baseball.

He was survived by his wife, Mary Frost McCue; two daughters, Susan F. And Carolyn B. McCue; and a son, **John C. McCue III '66**, all of Verona.
