ROBINSON, LTC WARREN SLAUGHTER JR. '47

Colonel Robinson, husband of Maggie Bell Roller Robinson, died 5 February 1947.

He was a graduate of Virginia Military Institute and taught mathematics at AMA for six years prior to his active duty with the US Army in 1917, where he served with the 314th Field Artillery. He left the service in 1922 and returned to AMA with his wife, the former Maggie Bell Roller, daughter of the school's founder.

The Robinsons lived in the original Roller home (now the Alumni House/Museum). She sponsored the YMCA and Bible Classes and was noted for her musical role in the Augusta Stone Church and the school. He taught mathematics and assumed additional duties as Assistant to the Principal and Assistant Commandant. Their home offered hospitality to countless visiting patrons and to young ladies attending dances at AMA.

"Boots" Robinson was respected and well-liked by patrons, faculty and cadets alike. He was a good balance to the Roller brothers until his death in 1947. Maggie Bell survived him and remained in the home until her death on 25 January 1956.
