David Wilson Smith, '62

November 25, 1944 - July 25, 1965

David attended AMA one year as a day student and was a private.

Unfortunately, the RECALL often omitted individual photos of Day Students. Such was the case in 1962.

A speeding car and a sharp curve combined early Sunday morning to take the life of a 20-year-old Rt. 2, Staunton youth.

David Wilson Smith, son of Mr. and Mrs. H. Wilson Smith, died of a broken neck after the compact car he was driving went out of control on Rt. 6151 two miles east of Rustburg in Campbell County. Two passengers were injured slightly.



Besides his parents, young Smith is survived by two sisters, Mrs. Allen (Carolyn) Quick of Rt. 2, Staunton and Miss Linda Smith, at home; his paternal grandparents, Wallace E. Smith of Middlebrook and Mrs. William Frank Chandler of Baltimore.

The Augusta County native was born Nov. 25, 1944. He attended Augusta Military Academy, was graduated from Riverheads High School and was a student at Richmond Professional Institute.

Young Smith was a member of Mint Spring Methodist Church. He was formerly active in Boy Scout Troop 13 as a Scout and counselor.
