Charles Frederick Williams, '26

November 19, 1907 - December 3, 1991



RALEIGH — Dr. Charles Frederick Williams, 84, of 2616 Sherborne Place, died Tuesday. A native of Raleigh, he was the son of the late Col. Alfred William 11 and Charlotte Grimes Williams.

He was educated at Augusta Military Academy and the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He received his medical degree from Jefferson Medical University in Philadelphia and began his pediatric practice in Raleigh in 1938.

He helped establish the first baby clinic for black children in Raleigh and taught pediatric nursing at St. Augustine's College. Serving as a doctor in the Medical Corps, World War II, he helped establish a children's hospital in the Phillipines. His was the first unit to go to Japan to work in rehabilitation after World War II. As a consultant in infant and child care clinics in Mexico and Spain, he established the first clinic on evaluation of mental retardation in North Carolina. He was president of the North Carolina Pediatric Society. In later years, he was on the evaluation team on disabilities for the Social Security Administration.

Survivors include his wife, Betty Vaiden Wright Williams; daughter, Charlotte Williams Bridger of Raleigh; brother, Alfred Williams Jr. of Raleigh and granddaughters, Charlotte Vaiden Kramer, Andria Bryan Bridger and Sloan Grimes Bridger.

Funeral service will be held 2 p.m. Thursday at Christ Episcopal Church. Burial will follow in Oak-wood Cemetery.
