

Three join AMA Sports Hall of Fame

A five sport man at Augusta. A rock `em, sock `em defensive back. And a marksman who is still winning trophies. These are the three Augusta alumni inducted into the AMA Sports Hall of Fame for 2013.



Bobby Bowie, `47, was captain of the football and fencing teams at AMA, wrestled, played baseball and ran track. **Doug Carter, `72**, was a great defensive back at North Carolina State and a high school football coach. **Mike Payne, `76**, led the AMA Rifle Team and is one of only 61 people ever to be certified by the NRA in three disciplines: shotgun, rifle and pistol.

This was the sixth year for the Sports Hall of Fame. Forty individuals and one team have been inducted from the more than 13,000 cadets who attended AMA and their coaches. Of the 40, 33 are former cadets and seven were coaches, including **General Roller**.

The team was the 1969-70 basketball team coached by **Jim Hogg** and **Joe Josephson** who was inducted into the Hall the year before his unexpected death.
